

**Scenario:** You find someone who has collapsed in front of you. As you approach you determine your scene is safe and you start to approach the victim. Show me what you would do.

Initial Scene Management
<ul> <li>Check for breathing and responsiveness for no more than 10 seconds</li> <li>Calls for help, directs someone to call 911 and get an AED</li> </ul>
Instructor informs the candidate that the victim is not breathing, not responding, and does not have a pulse.

Immediate CPR	Rescue Breathing	
<ul> <li>Perform high-quality CPR</li> <li>Proper hand placement</li> <li>Proper depth</li> <li>Allows for chest recoil</li> <li>Right rate &amp; rhythm</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Provides two rescue breaths after 30 chest compressions</li> <li>Does not delay compressions for more than 10 seconds</li> <li>Ensures chest rise</li> <li>Stops on chest rise</li> </ul>	
Continued CPR		
Resumes chest compressions with a 30:2 ratio		

AED Deployment
<ul> <li>Deploys AED while continuous high-quality CPR and rescue breathing is performed</li> <li>Turns AED On</li> <li>Place pads on victim</li> <li>Follow AED prompts</li> <li>Safely delivers shock (if required)</li> <li>Resumes high-quality CPR on AED direction</li> </ul>

Each student must perform all steps, but may be spread across multiple scenarios.
